Dear Ms. Dortch,

Competitive Carriers Association, CTIA, the Hearing Loss Association of America, the National Association of the Deaf, Telecommunications for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, and the Telecommunications Industry Association (collectively, the "Consensus Proposal Participants") submit this *ex parte* letter to inform the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") of an important collaborative step toward exploring the shared goal of expanded hearing aid compatibility ("HAC") compliance for wireless handsets.

Today, the Consensus Proposal Participants released a Request for Information ("RFI") seeking a partner, facilitator, and convener ("Administrator") to help manage and lead a consensusbased process to provide a report and recommendation to the Commission regarding the potential for 100 percent HAC compliance, pursuant to the Joint Consensus Proposal adopted in the Commission's 2016 *Report and Order*.¹ The Consensus Proposal Participants are soliciting information to identify an Administrator with the technical, legal, and administrative expertise to help manage this consensus-based process, which will carefully weigh the goal of HAC for all wireless handsets with the need to encourage continued innovations that can benefit all consumers, including those who use hearing aid devices or cochlear implants.
